Jeff spoke about being one of the co-founders of the famous Steppenwolf Theatre, along with Highland Park High School buddy Gary Sinise, and his deep roots in our city which have greatly influenced his long-lasting career that includes starring and guest roles in many popular TV series such as Scandal, Nash Bridges and Grey's Anatomy.
